Proposed Abortion Services (Safe Access Zones) (Scotland) Bill

Introduction

- 1. The Royal College of Nusing (RCN) is the world's largest professional organisation and trade union formusing staff, with members in the NHS, independent and third sectors. RCNS colland promotes patient and nusing interests by campaigning on issues that affect members, shaping national health policies, representing members compactice and employment issues and development opportunities.
- 2 The RCN vekces the opportunity to respond to Gilian Madény's MSP consultation on the Proposed Abortion Services (Safe Access Zone) (Scotland) Bill. - 3 RCNScotlandsupports the intention behind the proposed Abortion Services (Safe Access Zones) (Scotlant) Bill. While we have not received a significant number of representations from members who feel threatened by protests at sites, we strongly support the principle that staff and services users should be able to access sites without any impedment or fear:
- 4 Orsubnission is based on the RONs position statement¹ published in 2013 and updated in 2020 that supports RON members 'in providing the highest standards of compassionate care possible for women who droose to have a termination of pregnany and [...] providing support to those russing [professionals] who work to provide safe and quality care [...] We equally admost edge and respect those russes, midwives and health care assistants who have a conscientions objection with incurrent legislation' Our support for the proposed Bill does not in anyway detract from this position of respect for members who have a legitimate and conscientions objection with incurrent legislation

- 8 The RCN has a dear position in supporting its members as set out in our introduction. It does so by providing a finanework and negatively updated guidance for RCN members to 's upport registered nuses and midwives [within the N-B and independent sectors] fulfil their role in carring for those undergoing termination of pregnancy across the UK². This is set out within the scope and requirements of the Abortion Act 1967.
- 9 The RONs fianework also sets out the offical role the rusing polessional has in providing integral services like the termination of programy, which has not only led to dirical and professional development opportunities but has facilitated nusses alongs idemedical colleagues to take a pro-active role indeveloping services according to local mediforservice provision. In this context, the RON is keen to reiterate the importance that members that work with in these integral services providing compassionate, safe and high quality care are protected in their right to access the work place without being distressed, obstructed or eventual metised
- 10 Equily, it is worth noting that as per the exidence in the consultation, prochoice protesting activity remain is obtained events uneverly spreadouts identite sites that provide abortion services across Scotland Relatedly, feedback firmmembers in parted by these events has similarly been low via correspondence with the small numbers of RON members³ working directly in abortion services largely provided by the NHS However; as noted above, members working in other services, but on sites which provide abortion services may also be impacted by protests
- 11. Inthe context of the above points, the RCN agrees with the aims of the Bill, in particular with the meed to a) prevent nusing staff from being targeted or obstructed at work via the introduction of buffer zones and b) that these buffer zones should be applied consistently access the country.
