

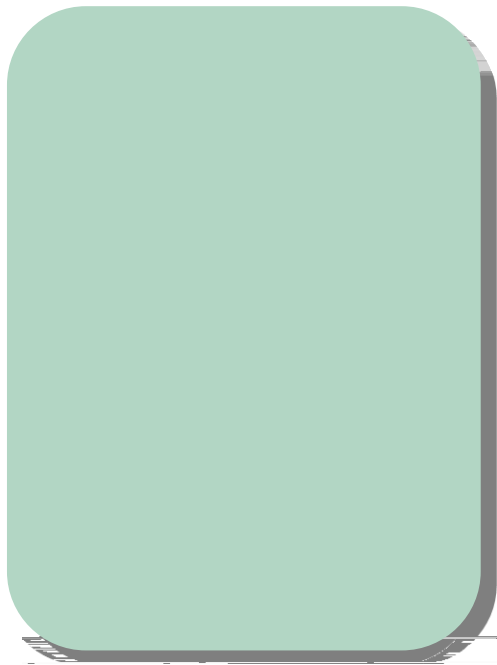

Pathways to Outcomes

The pathways to outcomes model set out below explain the inputs, outputs and outcomes for The Child and Family Service.

The economic assessment illustrates the potential for the service to contribute to the avoidance of negative outcomes in approximately 125 children and young people year on year. As the service develops there is potential for further work to quantify the impact of the service in the medium to long term and monetise the potential costs avoided as a result.

Ongoing

- Develop increased awareness of service maximising the amount of children and young people able to access family support +/- 1-1 support.
- Continue hospice staff education to reiterate the importance of inclusion of children when caring for a dying patient, providing holistic care for the whole family.
- Increase the reach of the schools' projects in the hospice catchment area. This in turn will increase the support available to children and young people and increase our referrals.
- To extend the reach of service provision into the community, enabling families to access support in their local community rather than having to travel into the Hospice.
- Increase staff /volunteer capacity to enable service to grow to maximise service capacity and impact.
- Follow up the outcome of service provision to evidence
