

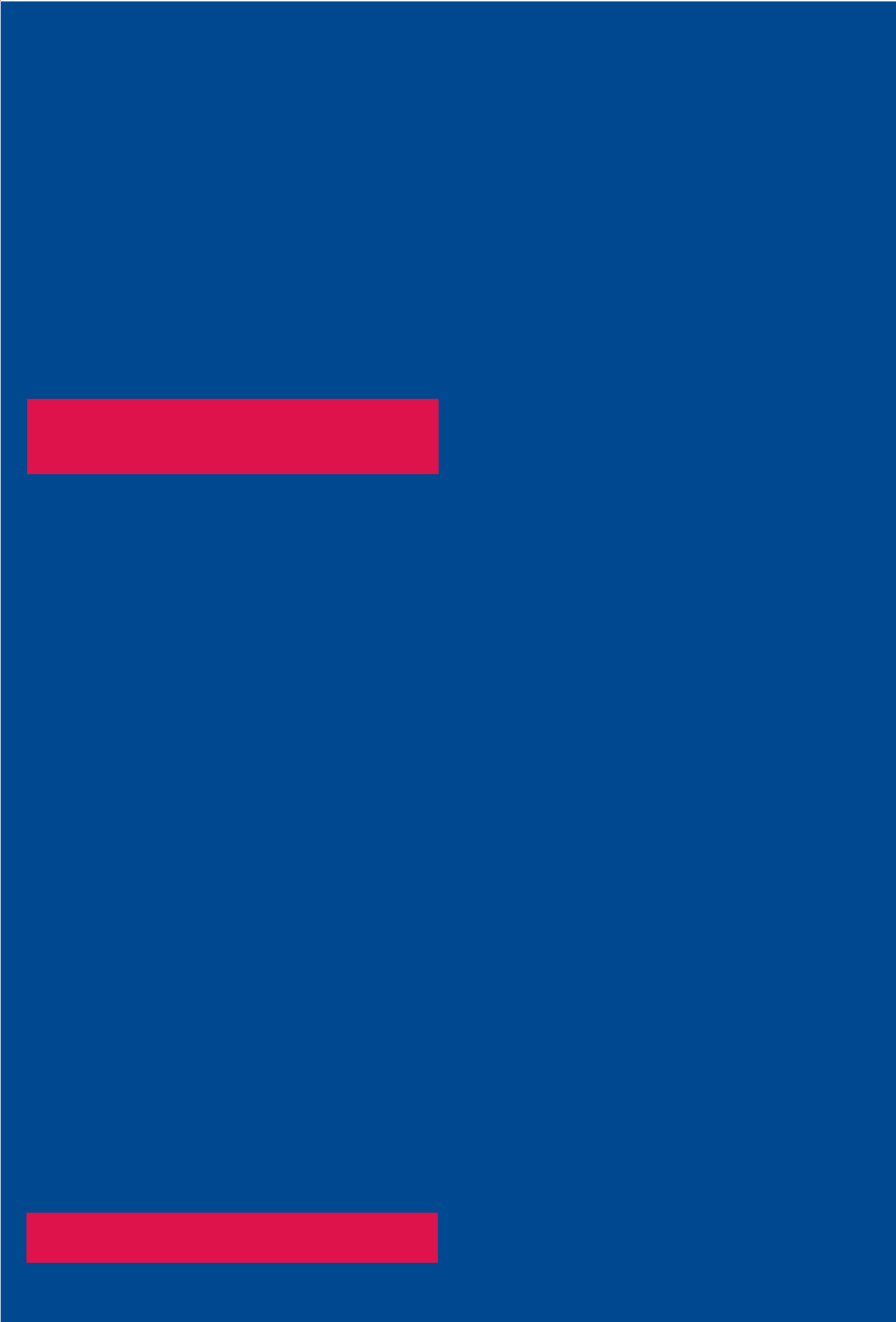


Why are human rights relevant
